

Review of our work in 2022

The focus of 2022's activity was our team's first visit back to Tanzania since 2018. In September we held a guide training conference at the College of African Wildlife Management in Moshi in collaboration with our partner EXODUS TRAVELS FOUNDATION (ETF). Afterwards selected members of the team went on to climb Mount Meru (4550m) guided by two of our Mountain Lioness awardees from 2020: Lightness Samwell Laizer and Wadia Kitaba Kapanya. The trip has confirmed to us that our work is still very much needed and given us a renewed focus and direction for the future to ensure we continue to help those in the most need and that our donors money is put to its best effect.

This year marks 10 years since ROB was founded and this is certainly something to celebrate. Since then, we have helped over 150 men and women with educational scholarships. We hope to return to Tanzania in the autumn to gather with those who we have helped, and those who have helped us, and continue our work. Our biggest thanks as always goes to our donors who have now enabled us to help transform the lives of over 150 Tanzanians



GUIDE TRAINING CONFERENCE

We welcomed 60 delegates comprising current and past awardees, employers, and other key stakeholders: including representatives from the National Parks, guide and porter associations and Mwecka college. Our key note speaker was Angela Nyaki the Park Commander in Chief of the Kilimanjaro National Park (KINAPA). We were delighted to hear that post-Covid tourists were returning to the park in large numbers and that there is still need for more qualified guides to work in the park. She especially congratulated ROB and Exodus on their Mountain Lioness Project, challenging us to continue our work as it's a key priority for the park to increase the number of female guides.

After the event some of the ROB team, and Hilary Thomas from Exodus Travels Foundation, were guided to the top of Mount Meru (4550 metres) by two previous awardees: Wadia and Lightness. It was a very special moment to be together sharing the summit and celebrating the start of their guiding careers.



A Word from Yvonne


